Attached is an Expression of Interest Form for the **Oceania Cubs / Chicks Divisions**; information below.

Could you please send the information out to your Basic Novice A & B skaters who fit the criteria below, and complete & return the attached Form to ISA Administration by **31st March, 2018**.

Skaters will be selected using scores on the ISA rankings documents. Advice re successful nominations will be available shortly after close of entries.

Skaters are encouraged to wear their club or State jackets at the event, however, if they wish to purchase an Australian jacket the style permitted for these divisions is the "ISA Members Jacket".

We would like to offer additional divisions to the Oceania International Novice Figure Skating Competition. These divisions will be part of an Interclub international competition and will provide opportunities to our younger skaters.

Please see the information below regarding the Interclub Chicks and Cubs divisions:

Chick/Cubs information:

CUBS GIRLS - born: 1.7.2007 – 30.6.2009 Free Skating, 2min+/- 10 sec

CUBS BOYS - born: 1.7.2007 – 30.6.2009 Free Skating 2min +/- 10 sec

CHICKS GIRLS - born 1.7.2009 and younger Free Skating, 2min +/- 10 se

CHICKS BOYS - born 1.7.2009 and younger Free Skating, 2min +/- 10 sec

A well balanced CUBS Free Skating Program must contain:

a) Maximum of 4 jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only the two most difficult jumps will be counted. Only two (2) jumps can be repeated in a jump combination or jump sequence. Triple jumps are not permitted. Any single or double jump (including Double Axel) cannot be executed more than twice in total.

b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is allowed.

c) There must be a maximum:

For Girls one (1) Choreographic sequence which includes at least one 3 seconds long spiral position. The sequence will have a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

For Boys maximum of one (1) step sequence with a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

Level explanation: For Cubs in all elements which, are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance

The factor of the Program Components is 2.5

A well balanced CHICKS Free Skating Program must contain:

a) Maximum of 4 jump elements for Girls and Boys, one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or sequences. Jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. A jump sequence can contain any number of jumps, but only the two most difficult jumps will be counted. Only two (2) jumps can be repeated in a jump combination or jump sequence. Triple jumps are not permitted. Any single or double jump (including Double Axel) cannot be executed more than twice in total.

b) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination with or without change of foot (minimum of six (6) revolutions in total) and one spin with no change of position and with or without change of foot

(minimum of six (6) revolutions in total). Flying entry is allowed.

c) There must be a maximum:

For Girls one (1) Choreographic sequence which includes at least one 3 seconds long spiral position. The sequence will have a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

For Boys maximum of one (1) step sequence with a fixed Base value and evaluated in GOE only.

Level explanation: For Chicks in all elements which, are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The Program Components are only judged in

- Skating Skills
- Performance

The factor of the Program Components is 2.5

The same ISU Rules regarding judging, refereeing and the work of the Technical Panel apply as in Junior and Senior International Competitions.

In case of a large number of entries the Organiser reserves the right to split the groups according to age.
