



2023 SFSC MEMBERSHIP CONDITIONS

(1 January – 31 December 2023)

By applying for financial membership to SFSC, you agree:

1. To abide by the SFSC Constitution, SFSC Code of Conduct and all SFSC Policies as in force during 2023.
2. That all new membership applications are subject to the approval of the SFSC Committee.
3. To ensure that you abide by the conditions of any rink that you are training and/or competing at so as not to bring yourself and SFSC into disrepute by your conduct.
4. To participate in 2 volunteering activities for SFSC in any of the following ways, totalling no less than 6 hours/skater for the year, and of which one activity must be a fundraising activity:
 - 4.1 Support a fundraising activity such as a Bunnings BBQ and/or Cadbury chocolate fundraiser or any other fundraising activity as determined by the Committee;
 - 4.2 Volunteer at either the SFSC Champs/Trophy Night competition and/or the Hollins Trophy/Hollins International Trophy competition and/or Presentation Night and/or any other SFSC activity as determined by the Club during 2023;
 - 4.3 Other assistance to the Club throughout the 2023 membership year (e.g. volunteering goods and/or services for the benefit of the club such as donations for raffles, volunteering on the committee or subcommittee etc.).
5. To the publication of skating related photos and/or footage of me/my skater, for whom I have parental responsibility, for promotional purposes.
6. That if applying as a new financial 2023 SFSC skating member (i.e. you were not a financial SFSC member in 2022), you must apply as a new member and represent SFSC in at least one of the following disciplines if competing/intending to/were to compete:
 - 6.1 Singles
 - 6.2 Artistic
 - 6.3 Inclusive (special needs)
 - 6.4 As part of a Pairs Team
 - 6.5 As part of an Ice Dance Couple or Solo Ice Dance
 - 6.6 As a skater in one of SFSC Club's established Majestic Ice Australia (MIA) Synchronised teams (subject to MIA's selection and approval process).



7. That if applying as a renewing financial SFSC skating member in 2023, and you were a financial SFSC skating member in 2022, must represent SFSC in at least one of the following disciplines if competing/intending to/were to compete:
 - 7.1 Singles
 - 7.2 Artistic
 - 7.3 Inclusive (special needs)
 - 7.4 As part of a Pairs Team
 - 7.5 As part of an Ice Dance Couple or Solo Ice Dance
 - 7.6 As a skater in one of SFSC Club's established Majestic Ice Australia (MIA) Synchronised teams (subject to MIA's selection and approval process).
8. The only exception to point 7 above, is those skaters applying as a renewing financial SFSC skating member in 2023 (and who were a financial SFSC skating member in 2022), but were admitted to membership on the basis that you were coached by a COIR accredited coach at COIR in 2022 or on such other basis as approved at the time. In this limited circumstance you may renew your membership for 2023 even if you do not represent SFSC in a relevant discipline outlined in point 7.
9. That irrespective of whether you were as a financial SFSC skating member in 2022 or you are admitted to membership in 2023, the following conditions apply:
 - 9.1 If selected to skate in one of the MIA Synchronised teams that ordinarily represents SFSC, member skaters must represent SFSC in this discipline and be a financial SFSC member for 2023.
 - 9.2 Member skaters cannot represent SFSC and another figure skating club in the same discipline.
10. That only in exceptional circumstances will the SFSC Committee consider requests for SFSC Membership where the skater would otherwise not be able to satisfy the above membership conditions. A written request must be submitted to the committee care of the Secretary at SFSC@sydneyfigureskatingclub.com. Membership will require approval from the SFSC Committee and payment of the appropriate fee.
11. That the SFSC Committee reserves the right to refuse any membership application and does not have to provide reasons for its decisions.
